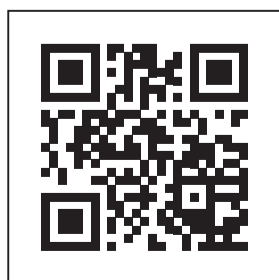

What is KTP?

Knowledge Transfer Partnerships (KTP) is a UK-wide programme part-funded by Innovate UK, or other government co-funders, which enables businesses to improve their performance. By working in partnership with the University of Wolverhampton and a recent graduate to lead the project, businesses can take their organisation to the next level by instilling change, launching new products, or revolutionising the marketplace.

What are the benefits to your business?

- A high calibre graduate to spearhead your project.
- Support from an academic member of staff.
- Access to the University's extensive resources and facilities.
- Reduced project costs, through funding by Innovate UK.

Programme information

- Any size business or not-for-profit organisation may apply.
- Projects can last between 12 and 36 months.
- The amount of grant you can get for your project will depend on the size of your business, typically:
 - small and medium-sized enterprises contribute around one-third of the project costs.
 - large businesses contribute about half of the project costs.
