

THE UNIVERSITY OF WOLVERHAMPTON

Bye-Law No. 4 Relating to the Registration of Students and the Provision of Educational and Other Services by The University

1. Every student and associate student of the University is required:
 - (a) to register formally as a student of The University of Wolverhampton at or before the commencement of each year or other defined stage of the relevant course of studies; and
 - (b) at that time to sign an undertaking -
 - (i) to abide by the Bye-laws, Regulations, Rules and Codes of Conduct laid down by the University, and
 - (ii) to pay or cause to be paid to the University by the due dates all fees and charges for tuition, accommodation and other services provided by The University of Wolverhampton.
2. The University of Wolverhampton reserves the right to withhold the provision of all University services for any student who fails to register or to give the required undertaking.
3. It shall be an express term of every contract between The University of Wolverhampton and each student for the provision of educational and other services that:
 - (a) Whilst the University will at all times endeavour to provide the teaching, examination, assessment and other educational services ("the educational services") set out in its prospectuses, brochures, course guides, handbooks and leaflets, the provision of all or any of the educational services cannot be guaranteed and The University of Wolverhampton reserves the right at any time to modify or cancel or re-arrange any such services in whole or in part, as it should think fit.
 - (b) No liability can be accepted by the University should industrial action or circumstances beyond the control of the University prevent or interfere with the provision of the whole or any part of the educational services or cause the University to modify or re-arrange such services.
 - (c) The University of Wolverhampton will take all reasonable steps to consult students and to ensure that registered students affected by any of the matters referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) above are able to continue their education with the minimum amount of disruption.
 - (d) Each student is required to ensure that all fees due to the University for tuition, accommodation and the supply of other goods and services provided by the University are paid at the appropriate time. If any sums due to the University remain unpaid, the University reserves the right at any time to withdraw the provision of all or any of the University's services and facilities provided to the student and to withhold examination or assessment results and prohibit progress to the next stage on a course of study or the award of a qualification until such debts have been paid in full.
