

**STATUTORY INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS
(EDUCATION ACT 1994)**

- 1) The University of Wolverhampton Students' Union is the recognised association of students at the University. Conducting its affairs under a constitution approved by the Board of Governors, it represents its members and promotes their general interests as students. All enrolled students of the University are eligible to apply to become full members of the Union and are encouraged to join. However, membership is not compulsory and every student has the right not to be a member of the Union. Students who are not full members are not entitled to represent or be represented by the Union or to participate in its democratic processes. Students not wishing to be full members may have associate membership and participate in such activities and use such services (including social, recreational, sports, catering and welfare advice) as are provided by the Union for the generality of students at the University. The range of services provided by the University and the Union for all students (whether members of the Union or not) is sufficient to ensure that non-members are not unfairly disadvantaged. The code of practice prepared by the Board of Governors and information issued by the Union about the membership, governance, activities, affiliations and finances of the Union are published throughout the University and are available to all students in the Students' Union Offices, Learning Centres, Student Access Points and the HE Shop.
- 2) The University of Wolverhampton Students' Union is subject to the law relating to charities and is required to conduct its affairs having due regard to the law relating to charities. Particular details are contained in the Code of Practice for the University of Wolverhampton Students' Union, which is referred to above.
- 3) The University is committed to the principles of Freedom of Speech within the law and has an established Code of Practice on Freedom of Speech as required by law and which applies to all University and Students' Union premises, members and visitors. The Code of Practice is contained within the Regulations for Students referred to overleaf.

CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO THE PROVISION OF EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

The provision of educational services by the University of Wolverhampton is subject to terms and conditions of contract and, before signifying your acceptance of the offer enclosed, you are asked to note the following:

Every student of the University is required to register in a form prescribed by the University at or before the commencement of each year or other defined stage of the relevant course of studies and, at the time of registration, to sign an undertaking to abide by all the University terms and conditions, including by-laws, regulations, rules and codes of conduct.

Copies of the above documentation, collectively referred to as Regulations for Students, will be made available for inspection at the time of registration. These documents are, however, available for your inspection now upon application to the University at the address shown on the letter, which accompanies this statement.

Amongst the terms and conditions referred to are conditions limiting the University's liability should industrial action or other circumstances prevent or interfere with the provision of services or cause the University to modify or re-arrange any of the educational services offered. However, the University of Wolverhampton will take all reasonable steps to consult students, and to ensure that any students affected are able to continue their education with the minimum amount of disruption.

Students are required to ensure that tuition fees and all other sums due to the University for the provision of services (including assessment examination accommodation learning & IT resources social & recreational services) are paid promptly at the appropriate time, and, if any sums due remain unpaid, the University reserves the right to withdraw the provision of all University services and facilities and to suspend examination marking or other assessment of course work (which will impede progress on a course of study or the award of a qualification) until such debts have been paid in full.
