FEE STATUS

There are four main categories of fee status; **HOME/EU, ELQ, ISLAND** or **OVERSEAS**. All applicants are assessed on an individual basis to determine the applicable fee status. See **SECTION 9** for further details.

HOME/EU, ELQ or **OVERSEAS** fees are outlined in **SECTIONS 1** to **7** of this booklet.

ISLAND fees are outlined in **SECTION 8** of this booklet

FEE TYPES

For the purpose of tuition fees there are two types of fee;

STANDARD fees apply to the majority of HEFCE (Higher Education Funding Council of England) fundable courses. They also apply to a range of courses funded by other sources.

Standard fees are outlined in **SECTIONS 1** to **5** of this booklet.

NON-STANDARD fees are applied to specific courses. For more guidance on Non-Standard fees please see **SECTION 7** of this booklet.

CHANNEL ISLANDS & ISLE OF MAN ('ISLAND') FEES

The following fees apply to students who are resident in the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man and whose fee status is categorised as 'Island'.

8.1 Full Time Undergraduate "Island Fee"

The University will set its Full Time Undergraduate Island fees in line with the agreement reached between [Universities UK](#) and the Island Authorities of Guernsey, Jersey and the Isle of Man. The University of Wolverhampton is classed as a "Research" HE under the definition provided by Universities UK.

The applicable fee is determined by reference to subject area within which the course of study falls. The subject area is then mapped to the broad HEFCE Price Band.

GENERAL NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

A. Residential/Field Course Fees

Residential fees/Field Course Fees and Prescribed Fees are **additional** to tuition and registration fees.

Registration, residential or field course fees (where applicable) do **not** qualify for a fee reduction.

B. Loyalty Discounts for International Students

1. The University will apply a 20% loyalty discount for all University of Wolverhampton international graduate students progressing on to postgraduate programmes at the University.
2. The discount is conditional on the students having no outstanding fees at the time of their enrolment onto the postgraduate programme of study, and is also conditional on payment of fees due. In all cases students should confirm the date by which fees due must be paid with the International Centre.
3. The Finance Department will be responsible for determining whether the students have fulfilled the payment conditions set out in paragraph 2 above.
4. Fee invoices will be raised for the full fee, i.e. without discount. If the loyalty discount is due, the Finance Department will make the appropriate adjustment to the invoice value within the Finance System. (Students should be made aware that the invoice will be raised for the full, undiscounted value).
5. Students who receive a loyalty discount are not entitled to any further discount or Bursary.

C. Equivalent or Lower Qualifications (ELQ) Policy

The Government no longer provides funding to universities for Home/EU students who are studying for a higher education qualification that is equivalent to or at a lower level than one they have already achieved.

To compensate for the loss of funding the University charges higher tuition fees for Home/EU students studying on a programme leading to an equivalent or lower qualification (known as ELQ) than one they have already achieved.

There are a number of exemptions to this policy for which public funding will continue to be provided, including Foundation Degrees and for students who are receipt of Disabled Students Allowance. **It is important to note that students are assessed annually on an individual basis.** As such ELQ tuition fees only apply to students who have been assessed by the University as ELQ.

Details about the policy can be found in Annex K, paragraphs 10 – 37, of 'HESES10 Higher Education Students Early Statistics Survey 2010-11' which can be accessed from the [HEFCE](#) website.

Students liable to pay Overseas fees are unaffected by this policy.

D. Categories of Fee Status

Which fee category a student is placed within is determined by reference to UK legislation, namely 'The Education (Fees and Awards) (England) Regulations 2007'.

Generally students will pay, as applicable, the relevant Home/EU or ELQ fee if they meet the following criteria:

- an EC national on the first day of an academic year of the course; **and**
- undertaking the course in the United Kingdom; **and**
- has been ordinarily resident in the territory comprising the EEA and Switzerland and the overseas territories throughout the 3 year period preceding the first day of the first academic year of the course; **and**
- whose residence in the relevant territory has **not** for any part of the period been wholly or mainly for the purposes of receiving full time education

It is stressed that other exceptions and/or requirements must be taken into account if required by legislation. Additionally other categories of student may be eligible for the applicable Home/EU or ELQ fee e.g. refugees and children of Swiss nationals or Turkish workers.

The regulations can be complicated but independent advice is provided by [UKCISA](#) (UK Council for International Student Affairs).

A specific fee scheme applies to students resident in the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man. The University will set its Island fees in line with the agreement reached between [Universities UK](#) and the Islands' authorities. Please see **SECTION 8** for the 2011/12 fee levels.

The Overseas fee applies to students who do not fall within the Home/EU, ELQ or Island fee categories.

E. Fee Refunds

1. Withdrawals must have been notified by the dates below otherwise students will be liable for tuition fees for the entire academic year:

Courses starting:

September – October	by 1st December 2011
January – March	by 1st April 2012
April – June	by 1st July 2012

2. BTEC Registration fees will only be refunded if Edexcel has received notification of a withdrawal (date tbc but expected to be by 1st December 2011). Withdrawal procedures must be processed speedily for HND/C students incurring a registration fee to ensure the deadline is met.

F. Tuition fee guidance from the Directgov website

Directgov is the official government website for information about public services. The 'Education and Learning' section provides much useful guidance regarding fees. The [homepage](#) lists all the available sections including 'Education and Learning'.

G. Full Time Tuition Fees for Pre-September 2006 (Old System) Entrants

The majority of pre 1st September 2006 entrants onto full time undergraduate courses will have completed their studies. In cases where the 'old system' fee remains applicable (e.g. as a result of leave of absence) the tuition fee for 2011/12 will be **£1,345**.

GLOSSARY
