

Getting here

Getting to Wolverhampton City Campus by car

Junction 10 of the M6 is the nearest motorway junction. Follow the signs for Wolverhampton along the A454. Upon reaching the ring road (A4150), follow signs for the Molineux Centre for limited **free** parking at Wolverhampton Wanderers Football Club – Molineux Stadium. Access to the car park is from Molineux Street. The sat nav postcode for Molineux stadium is **WV1 4QR**.

From the car park, the Open Day entrance is a 5 minute walk. With the stadium on your right, walk along Molineux Street towards the underpass. Go through the underpass then up the stairs to your left. Turn right at the top of the stairs. The entrance to the Open Day will be ahead of you to your left.

The nearest public car parks are below, and are signposted from the ring road:

Getting to Walsall Campus by car

Junction 9 of the M6 is the nearest motorway junction. Take the A461 towards Walsall and then stay right at the fork onto the A4148 – signposted Birmingham (A34) / Bescot Stadium.

Continue along the A4148 for about 5 minutes (you will pass The Performance Hub on the left) until you reach a double mini-roundabout. Take the first exit and then the first exit again,

signposted Walsall town centre. Take the first road on the left (Jesson Road) and then turn left again into Gorway Road. The car park will be on your right, use **WS1 3BD** for your sat nav.

Current building work on our Wolverhampton City Campus is part of an exciting programme generating £250m of investment.

The Our Vision, Your Opportunity programme will see the University of Wolverhampton make the biggest investment in its history to drive economic growth for the benefit of students and the wider region. Over the next five years the ambitious project will include world-class new buildings and facilities, as well as investment in teaching, research and skills training. The aim is to enhance the experience for students, develop the region's skill base and ultimately help produce new jobs and economic regeneration.

Our impressive Rosalind Franklin Science Centre is now open. Covering more than 6,000 square metres, it includes state-of-the-art laboratories, teaching and meeting rooms. Building work is also continuing on the new University of Wolverhampton Business School, ready for opening this autumn.

They add to other work carried out in recent years across our campuses, including new Students' Unions at City and Walsall plus the development of The George building (formerly the Varsity pub) as a focal point for advice and information.
