

Building Control Surveying Degree Apprenticeship Level 6

Chartered Building Control Surveyors are highly trained and experienced members in the built environment profession. They are usually Corporate Members of Chartered Institute of Builders (CIOB) and/or other similar professional bodies. They are property professionals who provide diverse services and offer impartial, specialist advice on a variety of property development control issues. They work in all fields of property and building consultancy.

As a Building Control Surveyor Degree Apprentice, you will be part of an extensive team responsible for the planning, development and valuation of built environment projects. You will develop a wider understanding of built environment process required to become a built environment professional/practitioner and have the opportunity to progress both professionally and academically. Through the Degree Apprenticeship programme, you will develop the skills, knowledge, behaviours and an appreciation to address a wide range of issues and to lead and work with others in the delivery of successful projects. You will be supported by your employer and a skills coach on the programme. Course content includes elements of workbased learning, pre-contract studies, on-site decision making, management and liaison with clients, construction professionals and operatives.

Job roles/Occupations

On completion of the Apprenticeship, as a Building Control Surveyor you will act on behalf of clients or employers to provide professional services as a: building control surveyor; planning and development building control surveyor or consultant (professional). In this capacity your role will include (but not limited to:)

- providing professional advice and recommendation to clients relating to land, property or construction
- · managing client instructions from engagement to completion
- · liaising with other professionals
- · following due diligence in providing advice to clients
- · undertaking detailed inspection of building and building sites
- analysing information from inspections or visits to buildings, land and construction sites.

Benefits

Through the combined use of practical and educational experience and support, the Building Control Surveyor Degree Apprenticeship enables you to:

- gain the essential core skills and knowledge of all aspects of built environment management
- focus on the technologies, law, information management, finance, health and safety, sustainability and consultancy skills needed to deliver projects to professional and to quality standards
- develop transferable skills in the areas of valuation and appraisal, building surveys and planning law
- develop transferable skills of team working, independent learning, decision making and problem solving
- develop an awareness of and consider the impact and solutions to current management issues in your organisation and the built environment sector
- enhance your skills in construction and built environment relate projects, management of people and resources, leadership skills.

How it works

The Building Control Surveyor Degree Apprenticeship has been designed and developed in collaboration with employers, Local Authority Building Control (LABC) and professional bodies. The Degree Apprenticeship requires apprentices to attend three one-week intensive delivery sessions annually, as well as a three-day induction at the start of term, conducted at the University of Wolverhampton (or associated venue), this will be supported by webinars. The course requires that all modules must be successfully completed along with an end-point assessment (CIOB/CABE/RICS accreditation) in order to successfully complete the Apprenticeship.

Qualifications

The Degree incorporates vocational and academic elements. On successful completion of the programme you will achieve a BSc (Hons) Degree Building Control Surveying. You will also be assisted in securing Corporate Membership of the CIOB, CABE or RICS.

Entry requirements

You will need to be currently employed by a Local Authority and work for a minimum of 30 hours per week.

A minimum of three A-levels at grade C or higher (or equivalent) or a Level 3 Apprenticeship in construction or property related discipline.

Other relevant or prior experience may also be considered as an alternative. Age and experience are recognised and prospective apprentices may be required to attend an interview.

Apprentices without level 2 or equivalent (GCSE grade C/4 or higher) English and Mathematics (or unable to provide evidence of achievement) will need to commit to achieving this prior to taking the end-point assessment.

Fees and funding

For employers with a payroll below £3 million:

The Government will pay 95% of the cost of the Apprenticeship training and assessment for Apprentices of any age, for employers who will not be paying the Apprenticeship levy. You may also be eligible for extra employer incentives.

For employers with a payroll above £3 million:

From May 2017 employers will be able to use their Apprenticeship Levy contribution towards the cost of the Apprenticeship using their digital account. We will agree a payment schedule and discuss funding availability before you start your Apprenticeships and ensure the cost to your business is clear upfront.
