➤ Fees and finance

Funding

Most UK students studying a Master's course in the UK can apply for a Government loan to help with fees and living costs. Fees can be paid in instalments.

In 25/26 the Master's loan for students applying to Student Finance England will be £12,858. You must be studying a full Master's award of at least 180 credits. Eligibility criteria can be found at:

Full-time course fees

Fees shown are for a 180-credit course (equivalent to a full-time Master's). Lower credit courses (such as certificates and diplomas) are charged on a pro-rata basis.

Teacher training

Teacher training (PGCE) course fees and financial assistance are the same as for undergraduate degrees. You can apply for a student loan for tuition fees and living costs, and for a dependants' grant if eligible.

You may be eligible for a government bursary or scholarship if your course leads to qualified teacher status (QTS). You don't need to pay back this tax-free money when studying certain subjects. Search for "bursaries" at:

➤ Scholarships and bursaries

Alumni discount

University of Wolverhampton graduates can get a 20% discount on a postgraduate course taught on-site, or 10% off fully-online courses. There's no time limit on how long ago you completed your degree, as long as it's your first Master's-level qualification.

International Alumni Scholarship

Available for University of Wolverhampton graduates (including those from our partner institutions) for postgraduate taught on-site study only. If you have a First- or Second-class degree with us, you can receive between £2,000 and £3,000 dependent upon your results.

Dennis Turner Hardship Fund

A non-repayable fund for any eligible student, home or international, who is struggling to make ends meet. The fund doesn't affect the visa status of international students.

Sports Scholarship

Sport scholars can receive a performance package which includes financial support plus WLV Gym membership, BUCS membership, strength and conditioning, physiotherapy, sport psychology, and performance lifestyle support.

Social Work Bursary

Postgraduate social work students can apply for a bursary to help with living costs. If you're eligible for a bursary the NHS will also pay a contribution towards your tuition fees per academic year.

Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)

A single Disabled Students' Allowance of up to £27,783 (in 25/26) is available for students who have additional costs due to their disability or specific learning need. Students must complete a needs assessment prior to enrolling to assess the support they need.

Our sector knowledge and expertise include specialisms led by world-leading researchers. Academic excellence, outstanding facilities, professional accreditations, and industry links ensure our students are prepared for future careers in these growing sectors.

Architecture and construction

Springfield Campus is Europe's largest architecture and built environment campus. World-leading research is delivered on site, into brownfield regeneration, green innovation, and Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS). We are also a key partner for Wolverhampton city's Green Innovation Corridor project.

Professional services

Our employer-relevant academic programmes and tailored business services have run for over 80 years. We have the Midlands' largest and most successful Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development centre, are an approved centre for ILM, and hold membership of the Chartered Association of Business Schools. Law students benefit from our unique partnership with law firm DWP LLP to receive careers advice and mentoring.



Health and social care

We offer a range of courses tailored towards careers within this sector with specialist teaching facilities including world-class Anatomage tables, simulation wards and clinical skills labs.

Many courses are designed around the Health Education England (HEE) multi-professional framework for advanced clinical practice in England.

If successful on one of our nursing courses, you can apply to register with the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to practise as a registered nurse in a range of settings.



Sport

We have excellent professional links and partnerships with sport associations, clubs, and professional bodies, including Wolverhampton Wanderers FC and British Judo.

The School of Sport facilities have recently been upgraded as part of a £6 million pound refurbishment providing state-of-the-art skills-based teaching facilities for the preparation for, and return to active lifestyles, sport and physical activity.



Teaching and education

We partner with over 450 schools, colleges and private providers to offer placement opportunities, CPD and accredited courses.

All our routes for initial teacher training (primary, secondary, further education and skills, and post-compulsory education) are rated Good by Ofsted, who highlighted our extensive school partnerships with valuable placements, and our ability to develop effective and highly reflective practitioners.



Creative industries

Since the 1850s we've been at the core of the city's creative output. Today, our facilities ensure that our students are equipped with the ideal space and resources to develop their artistic skills to the highest level.

Our students develop employment skills and links through active engagement with industry leaders and live briefs.

Our multi-million pound Screen School facility represents a public-facing and dynamic industry-linked space to promote, develop and produce content designed for screen-based media.

Our research at the University of Wolverhampton is wide-ranging, and tackles everything from brain tumours to sperm mobility, cybersecurity to rainforest governance, and biodegradable dressings to the perception of regional accents.

Research centres are at the heart of our research strategy, which is driven by a desire to change the world for the better.

Our academics and researchers collaborate with others around the world, and the latest Research Excellence Framework, released in 2022, judged more than half of our output to be either internationally excellent or world-leading.

Our research focuses on three key themes of green innovation and sustainability; health and social care; and inclusive communities.

It benefits people and communities across the world, while its success and impact reflect the high quality of our teaching.

01 Visit: wlv.ac.uk

This will take you through to the relevant application form. You can apply directly for most of our postgraduate taught courses.

Exceptions include PGCE courses, which you will need to apply for via the UCAS teacher training website – search online for 'UCAS teacher training'.

Fast-track applications

University of Wolverhampton undergraduates wanting to progress directly on to a postgraduate course and University of Wolverhampton alumni wishing to return to study a postgraduate course can fast-track their application. Once you have your degree classification and meet the entry criteria for the course, you are eligible to complete a fast-track application, which is a quicker and shorter application process.**



**Eligible current students will automatically receive an offer letter for the aligned postgraduate course.



Advice and guidance

Our Gateway team provides advice and guidance on all aspects of coming to university, including choosing the right course; checking qualifications, entry requirements and your application form; and student funding and disability or support options.

Entry requirements

Our entry requirements help us to gauge whether you have the knowledge or experience to provide a good base to study at postgraduate level. We believe in providing opportunities to people with the passion to succeed, and our entry requirements are not always based on academic attainment alone.

You will usually require an undergraduate degree. Relevant work experience in your subject area can help you get a place for some courses. Visit the course page for up-to-date entry requirements.

Level 2 requirements: Equivalency courses

Non-teacher training courses:
