What we are doing

- Ensure fair Trade and Ethical supply chain.
- Period Poverty mitigation with free products available.
- Combating Digital Poverty
- University provides Dennis Turner Fund Bursary for students in difficulty
- Support for care leavers and underrepresented groups

What we could do

- Work with charities to align goals
- Work with procurement to develop polices etc that ensure all our partners re: working towards this objective and providing measurable evidence of the role they play.

SDG – 2 ZERO HUNGER

End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture

What we are doing

- Providing fresh, affordable and sustainable, nutritious food choices on campus through the Catering Service.
- Diverting food wastage by using the Too Good to Go App, through Catering Department
- Free Global Lunch for staff and students at Chaplaincy each Wednesday
- Free meals for students in need, delivered by the University catering teams

- Business School Breakfast Club (to be launched in FSE Soon)
- Increase grow your own initiatives such as growing fruit and vegetables to encourage healthy eating.
- Ensure supply chain are using sustainable agriculture and local supply chain
- Surplus food project working with local supermarkets to share surplus with students and community.
- Explore composting for food waste and coffee grounds, using compost on site.

What we are doing

- School of Business partnership course with ICAEW

- Incorporate sustainability into curriculum across all disciplines with commitment from schools to embed content that is meaningful and relevant to the course and to students.
- Provide students a Canva introduction to Sustainability at the Campus

What we could do

SDG – 6 CLEAN WATER & SANITATION

Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all

What we are doing

- Water fountains available on site
- Measure water consumption across Campuses

- Reduce water consumption (monitoring consumption, leak detection, upgrading facilities, specifying WRAS products)
- Apply BREEAM standards in the university planting and design to minimise water use and demand
- Investigating water harvesting, storage and reuse technologies
- Work with organisations such as water aid to support clean water in other nations.
- Fund toilet twinning; contributing to creating toilets where they aren't any.
- Research on Clean Water & Sanitation



SDG – 7 AFFORDABLE & CLEAN ENERGY

Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all

What we are doing

- Purchasing clean electricity on all assets
- Solar PV on some University Buildings
- Combined Heat and Power (CHP) units in operation
- Embed energy efficiency into Estates maintenance and projects

What we could do

- Investigating renewable technologies such as solar PV and heat pumps
- Consider purchasing 'green gas'
- Investigate energy efficiency projects to reduce energy demand

What we are doing

What we could do

- Transition and Promote sustainable transportation and mobility on campus for University fleet vehicles such as bike racks, showers, increased faster EV chargers, rationalised parking, car sharing
- Work with local partners to update travel plans.
- Considering heat network options feasibility
- Rationalising parking associated to distance between home address and work; promoting alternative sustainable transport options.
- Smart Health / Smart Transport/ Smart construction
- Smart Education (during covid)
- Smart Manufacturing
- Increase the use of Bots for food delivery
- Staff EV Car Lease scheme



SDG – 12 RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION & PRODUCTION

Ensure sustainable consumption, production and efficient management of natural resources.

What we are doing

- Central Waste Contract diverts over 90% general waste away from landfill to for use in recycling, energy recovery, composting and anaerobic digestion.
- WEE waste recycled and exchanged for new white goods.
- Confidential paper waste recycled
- Digital print source and dispose of paper, ink and other materials responsibly
- Sustainable purchasing standards and tender questions during procurement process.
- Recycling used cooking oils and food waste.
- Pre-loved items available from Chaplaincy
- Working with Lenovo to workshop on sustainability going forwards, including adopting biodegradable bamboo packaging

- Standardised Sustainable Procurement Strategy and purchasing standards.
- Divert more waste from landfill through reduction and recycling
- Explore composting for food waste and coffee grounds, using compost on site.
- Enhance Waste stream awareness by unifying stickers across campuses and Accommodation.
- Promote circular economy and zero waste programs by exploring reverse vending machines and new technologies.
- Catering to offer sustainable packaging and provide information about the carbon footprint of meals.
- Promote intercampus sharing systems to re-use procured Items.
- Work with Laboratories to reduce waste.
- Explore upcycling for broken furniture.
- Work towards becoming a paperless organisation.
- Work with Accommodation to reduce waste from mattresses and bed packs.
- Reduce waste from refurbishment and construction projects.
- Cleaning without chemicals trial.



SDG – 13 CLIMATE ACTION



Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts

What we are doing

- Conduct Decarbonisation audits
- Implementing energy efficiency measures to reduce consumption such as LED lighting and more efficient boilers.
- Conducting estate wide surveys to assess Decarbonisation potential.
- Working with Asset Management and Delivery to review heating and cooling use in buildings to reduce consumption.
- Reviewing Temperature Policy.
- University signed up to Race to Zero committing to zero carbon emissions by 2050.
- Funding (PSDS) secured for heat pumps and Solar PV to decarbonise Walsall Campus.
- Procurement includes Environmental, Social & Economic considerations in all contract tenders.

What we could do

- Develop carbon reduction roadmap for implementation with appropriate funding streams.
- Improved energy and water use monitoring.
- Create Climate Change Impacts Risk Register to monitor, take action, and report on.
- Devise Sustainability impact assessment for all University Policies and budget making decisions.
- Produce guidance for construction projects
- Work with Laboratories to measure and reduce energy consumption.
- Analyse and report on scope 3 emissions in more detail.
- Linking with the Net Zero Government Initiative Roadmap for zero emissions from Public Sector Buildings.
- Working with Asset Management and Delivery to review heating and cooling use in buildings to reduce consumption.
- Reviewing Temperature Policy.
- · Analyse and report on scope 3 emissions in more detail.
- Improved energy and water use monitoring.



SDG – 14 LIFE UNDERWATER

Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources and coastal ecosystems

What we are doing

- •As a University we follow the Marine Stewardship Council guidelines
- •The university only procures MSC certified fish for all catering outlets.
- •Research into biodegradable polymers and <u>plastic waste reduction</u> through the Centre for International Development and Training (CIDT).
- Aquaponics research

- Work with Stakeholders to identify additional objectives.
- Raise awareness of polluted rivers.
- Supporting aquatic ecosystems through education and engagement.
- Investigate research contributing to conservation and sustainable utilisation of the aquatic ecosystems.
- Work towards reducing plastic waste on campus.



SDG - 15 LIFE ON LAND

Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss

What we are doing

- Enhance green space on campus such as Woodland Trust free trees and Planters.
- Construction projects biodiversity net gain.
- Planters outside chaplaincy growing fruit, vegetables and flowers.
- Waste and recycling removed from campus by Operations teams and contractor.

What we could do

- Measure and enhance biodiversity on campus through wildflower meadows, bird boxes, bug hotels, natural vegetation.
- Update university waste policies.



SDG – 16 PEACE, JUSTICE & STRONG INSTITUTION

Promote peaceful and inclusive societies and provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels

What we are doing

- Have elected representation on the university's highest governing body
- Student Union as a democratic union run by students for students.
- Provide training for all staff on diversity, inclusion, bias, safeguarding and bribery

- Produce information for screens around campuses.
- Inclusion of Sustainability in Students Welcome Packs.
- Waste Streams Awareness Campaigns.
- Event weeks such as 'switch it off'
- Engagement with Students Union and relevant Student Societies
- Host conferences with Sustainability themes.

What we are doing
