Our 2-week or 4-week courses include:

- ▶ Self-catered accommodation in halls of residence (private, en-suite bedroom with shared kitchen facilities), at either our Wolverhampton City Campus or Walsall Campus.
- Placement test on arrival
- ▶ 14 hours of English classes (per week)
- ▶ 4 hours of elective classes (per week)
- ▶ 1 national day trip & ½ day local trip (per week)
- ► Evening social programme
- ► End of course presentation
- Certificate and report on completion

English classes

- You will be in a class suitable for your level of English.
- Mixed gender classes.
- Classes focus on speaking and listening skills.
- Classes are lively and interesting.
- ▶ Highly trained and experienced teaching staff.
- ▶ Classes include culture-based lessons to develop intercultural skills.
- ► Group work develops your confidence and interpersonal skills along with language competency.
- You will also develop academic and presentation skills.



Elective subjects

Students enjoy using English to learn about subjects they have an interest in. For this reason we run special elective classes on Monday and Tuesday afternoons, for example:

- Art and design: Visit art galleries, learn about art using English, and produce still life, collage, pop art and oil-based paintings.
- ▶ Professional communications and media: This elective combines fun classes in photography, learning English through music and stop motion animation with employability skills lessons in areas such as soft skills development, negotiation and group work.
- ▶ Special interest classes can be created for university groups of 13 or more.

- ▶ Winter Schools: offered in January and February: 2-week or 4-week stays available.
- Summer Schools: offered in July and August: 2-week or 4-week stays available.

Social Programme

By train:

- ► Birmingham 20 minutes
- ► Manchester and Liverpool –
- ▶ 1 hour 20 minutes
- ► London 1 hour 40 minutes
- ► Edinburgh 4 hours 30 minutes
- ▶ Birmingham Airport -40 minutes

By plane:

Paris, Amsterdam, Berlin and Barcelona all less than 2 hours' away.



Accommodation

Students typically stay in university-owned halls of Accommodation includes: residence a short walk from classes.

Our Summer School is based at our Wolverhampton City Campus, with student accommodation a short walk to the university, city centre and train station.

Our Winter School student accommodation is provided at both Wolverhampton City Campus, and Walsall Campus, which has student accommodation on-site.

- Private room with en-suite bathroom
- ▶ Single bed with bed linen
- ▶ Wi-Fi access
- ▶ Shared, fully-furnished kitchen (including cookware and cutlery) and living areas
- Five students per kitchen
- ▶ Use of self-service laundry facilities
- ≥ 24-hour, on-campus security

You may choose to prepare all your meals yourself. Alternatively there are many independent food outlets available in town to buy meals, or you can buy breakfast and lunch on-campus at one our university catering outlets.
